It's harvesting season once again, and TH Fish and Wildlife Branch is requesting your harvest data. This is important for TH as a government to exercise rights provided under the Final Agreement and to help us manage our resources in traditional, sustainable ways. Helpful information includes:

- **Number of fish and/or wildlife harvested**
- **Female / male**
- **Size / age / condition**
- **Gear type used**
- **Hours of effort**
- **General location**
- **Any information about change on the land**
- **Anything of concern you would like Fish & Wildlife to monitor**

## **LAND-USE PLANNING PROCESS TO RESUME**

The Dawson Regional Land Use Planning (DRLUP) Commission is expected to be officially appointed in the near future. The commission will be made up of six appointees (three nominated by Yukon Government, three nominated by Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in) who will guide the regional land use planning process for the Dawson region in Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Traditional Territory.

Regional land use planning stems from the Umbrella Final Agreement, with the goal of Parties (TH & YG) working together to determine acceptable activities for (all) areas within the Traditional Territory. This planning process will designate areas that support activities such as development, recreation, traditional pursuits and protection for present and future use.

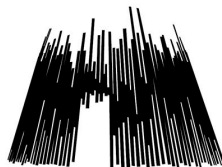
